Each story comes from our minds but every vision arises only from ambition.

Our vision is to become the leading organization for the development and systematization of art and culture in Europe. We are confident that the company can implement strong changes and improvements to the development of art and culture.

The main goal of our activities is filling up the empty spaces that are bad promotion for the owner of the building. That includes different spaces, for example shops, warehouses, halls, alleys, hallways, etc. that we transform to temporary cultural spaces with minimal investment. That does not only include the empty spaces that are waiting for their new potential owners or buyers, but also spaces which lack their soul and have not entirely come to life yet.

Decorating the business space with artwork /

The renter or the owner of the space enables us to use his empty walls, halls and lobbies. We decorate his space with paintings, statues or other artwork for free. By that, we gain more exhibition space and better opportunities for promoting the artists. The renter or the owner gains a decorated space. All the exhibited artwork is always available for sale. Every artwork has a plate with the name of the author, its title and the price. Every author of the exhibited artwork has a board in the space with the description and his contact information.

The possibility of forming the concept for events and activities /

We set up the concept for the owner or the renter free of charge by using artwork as the supplement to the current event that adds the additional value to it and promotes the cultural aspect. Free of charge we can set up the art scene where the artwork is for sale (the event organizer gets 10% provision of the sold items). We can set up the art corner where we intro- duce the concept and the authors who are exhibited.

Cultural activities outdoors /

We organize cultural activities outdoors for the renter, while he has to provide the space and all the material needed. We introduce different musicians, painters, sculptors and others who want to promote their work in a space with good frequency and add to the vivacity of the shopping centre.

Filling up the empty spaces with cultural content /

With the owner of the space we agree on renting the space for free by signing a lease and a sponsorship contract. The owner guarantees no regular costs for the space (electricity, water, the supplement for the building land, heating, security, insurance, etc.). We bring new content to the space by transforming the warehouses into galleries, lobbies into young artists' presentation boards, shops to studios, etc. We take care of all the materials, requisites and the inventory we need. Not only we bring the cultural aspect to the space, but we also enrich it with other activities. Most often we decorate the space with artwork. We adapt the concept and the contextual scheme to the current state of the space. By that we do not invest excessively in redesigning it. Then we primarily organize cultural events, such as exhibitions, presentations, lectures, travelogues, workshops, courses, meetings, etc. However, we can use the space for other events that are not directly linked to culture, for example organizing a business meeting in a gallery, the presentations of one company's products, showrooms, etc. Since we get he space for free, we can not rent it forward. That is why we only charge for the organisational costs that are in a way renting a space. The organisational cost include the preparations (the working hours, the equipment needed, the transport, etc.).

The organisa- tional cost is from 5% to 15% of the price that was primarily set by the owner for renting the space. Our price therefore varies according to the size of the space, its state and the level of dif culty it requires for setting up an event in it. This concept does not allow renting the space as a permanent of ce, shop or promotional space. It can be done so only with the agreement of the owner.

We always agree with the owner on the notice regarding renting his space, since the owner searches for interested renters regularly. When the owner has a new renter (frequently we get the future renters via different events), he informs us about it before giving the space for rent (the deadline is set with the agreement of both sides) and we move our items to another location. At the end, the owner is left better off, since he has to maintain the empty space anyway. Since it is empty, it is a bad promotion for him so the number of the visitors and activities decreases. We get the exhibition spaces where we can be active with our activities and by that offer bigger range of areas that people need but do not know how to access it or are not aware of its existence.

This is why we decided to make another fresh new change together with our long-time general partner and a great sponsor, the company BTC d. d. We have decided to connect entire Slovenia at the first Art Expo Ljubljana, which is going to be the biggest exhibition space for the creative industry in Slovenia. Through a high turnout of visitors and variety of offered products in the BTC City Ljubljana, we will create a new centre for the promotion of culture and development of individuals, organisations, galleries as well as other companies that shape cultural content in Slovenia.

Foreign exhibitors from the Czech Republic, Peru Ukraine, Russia and other countries are also a part of our Expo event that helps us increase an international recognition. ART Expo Ljubljana is the first and largest cultural event of this type in Slovenia. It will last for 14 days in an interesting and unusual location larger than 2000m2. The purpose of this event is to bring together a large number of artists, both domestic and foreign. One of the major goals is to help those artists who until now have not had the opportunity to exhibit, while furtherpromoting the already recognized and established creatives and offering them media and business support. Such events are a regular practice of major cities around the world, so it's time to join the biggest and best!

With the concept of a "FAIR LIKE" presentation we want to change the way of how people think in Slovenia. Addressing customers and authors themselves and showing them that not everything revolves only around galleries, studios and individual sales. In these times, unfortunately, it is not enough that the artist is only an artist he/she must be a businessman and a promotor of his own creative work. The mission of the event ArtExpo Ljubljana is to show the creative power and potential of Slovenia and enhance the image and stature of the current art scene in Slovenia and central and southern European region.

Get a first look at extraordinary fine art, painting, sculpture, photography, mixed-media work, glasswork, and more.

We're passionate about helping artists promote their work and grow their businesses. We think Andy Warhol had it spot-on when he said, decades ago, "Making money is art, and working is art, and good business is the best art." In a nutshell, we're here because we believe artists should receive fair compensation for their talent, and we're driven to find innovative new ways to make that happen.

ART Expo in Slovenia /

Though it may seem that visual arts are losing their noble quest and their status that they are pushed to the margins of our lives, and that they are literally drowning in the flood of visual imagery and events that try to persuade us with visual effects, we must nonetheless confess that they have become an integral and, for some, even an essential part of our lives.

Even more, luck has been on the side of art in 2017. Several important events are taking place in our surroundings, such as The Venice Biennale, Documenta 14 in Kassel, Sculpture projects in Münster, just to name a few of the most exposed. However, the artistic events characterized by creating surplus value are not only to be found in the neighbouring European countries - in this year one of them will also take place in Slovenia. The Art Expo an art fair where works of art and their creators are represented, an event that will be held for the first time, but is already placed among other important manifestations of visual art and visual culture as well as culture in a broad sense.

The Venice Biennale is an important visual arts event that enriches artistic and historical wealth of the City of Water every two years. In this year, its 57th edition is taking place and some Slovenian artists are also taking part in it. Documenta that has been held in Kassel every five years since 1955 is one of the most respected exhibitions of the modern art.

Sculpture projects Münster is the famous exhibition that has drawn artists from all-over the world since 1977 and enabled them to create in public places. The Art Expo is another highly anticipated event of 2017 - the event we could only dream of, or hope silently that it would, one day, take place. The AAMI Institute is changing ideas, dreams, expectations, longings, and visions into reality. All this is done with courage and determination, with a clear and strong concept. In one single place, the individuals with visible artistic potentials and their creations, authors of different generations, origins and manners of expression and nationalities will be represented. These fourteen days of the Art Expo will be full with art, creativity and multi-layered cultural events. All that was created in the intimacy of the studios and in various idea incubators, in places of development and realization, will be put on display for the connoisseurs and art lovers, for those who find value in admiring works of art, as well as for those who are willing to "adopt" them and see in them a business opportunity. In one place, it will be possible to gain an insight into the current visual-creative production, into varied artistic practices, into multimedia visual spheres. Though the concept of the event is a very broad one, it also enables an individual to not get lost in it. The representational fields, characterized by the fluidity of their genres, coexist in harmony and gain an even deeper meaning in the context of related disciplines. Every author has their own representational space and everyone is an indispensable part of the varied whole. Everyone reveals their own creative identity, their own style of expression and through that also their visions, ways of experiencing, ways of feeling, reflecting, all that which is the most intimate, the most private. It is the artistic conglomerate that enables everyone to be visible.

It seems that art has never been as varied, as full of artistic surpluses and also as unconventional as it is in the present moment. Right now, there is no prevalent style, everything is possible and (almost) everything is allowed. Artistic paths of interpretation are open wide. Perhaps this is the reason, why it is so difficult to keep abreast of all the developments in art and why it is so hard to understand it. Events such as the Art Expo, bring art closer to the people, make its perception easier and contribute to the insight into this enigmatic, never-fully-explored field of creativity. Most definitely, a meeting between art and its audience is something that must happen.

The Art Expo event enables us to act globally in the field of visual arts, to become integrated as a part of the European and international activities and to enable the presentation of our artefacts and to establish their circulation. Meanwhile, we would like to highlight the individuals, the artists whose creativity surpasses the sense of anaemic lack of power and reveals strength, specificity and intimism of their creative character. The rules in art are completely different. There is no space for a unified, globalised orientation.

Art in the sense of the highest form of culture has preserved our nation throughout its turbulent history and strengthened its identity. The Art Expo event gives us an opportunity to receive attention from abroad and to show our extraordinary artistic potential in one place.

The role of art is to magically intervene in our lives, to break boundaries, to convince and to connect through its universally understood language. This is what makes it a road to a multitude of goals that goes to the centre and to the very top of everything. It represents a possibility as well as an opportunity. This is the way that the individuals who formed the Art Expo perceive art.

We dare say that the Art Expo represents a breakthrough among the most visible and best-established artistic events. Through the Art Expo artists are able to gain attention and demonstrate the importance of their roles and meaning of their work. Visual goods are easily accessible nowadays and the computer screens and the web enable us to see many a piece of art. However, all of these new possibilities cannot compare to a direct contact with a work of art. What counts, is seeing the object with a naked eye, the experience of a visual vitality that every molecule of the visual structure is brimming with. Mysterious details and micro structures, enigmatic stories, all of these can only be perceived when our eyes touch the artefact directly, and this experience is even more complete when we have a chance to meet the artist. The Art Expo is an opportunity and a chance for all of this.

It is all too rare that we show some pride in our achievements or give praise, but AAMI Institute that gave birth to this idea undoubtedly deserves a big compliment. They carefully nourished their idea and grew through it and finally developed it to make its first step and to become the biggest cultural event in Slovenia and to be placed among the similar European and worldly artistic events.

Most definitely the project team does not rest on their laurels. They have a strong drive to achieve, reach into the future, and they are making deliberate moves for tomorrow in the field of contemporary visual arts. The concept of presentation

of art works at the art fair is clear and sound but it is only with the change in the mind-set of the artistic community, as well as of the broad society, that it will gain the necessary life force and vitality for its further growth. I hope and I believe that the very first and true shift has already been made. To really feel alive, we are forced to go beyond our limits. We must set ourselves free from the narrow-mindedness, the sense of restlessness, and discover a new world and become its integral part.

The Art Expo project is an excellent opportunity to promote artistic creativity and, in a broader sense, our country as well. It is also the only event of this kind in Slovenia. It is an event that has to be documented and leave its traces in time and space, while at the same time its task is to document the developments, to reach into the future and to establish a new tradition. There is a first time for everything, - and if we take Venice Biennale, it took it several years to develop into this much-anticipated event that it is today. May the ART EXPO become the future and through that also a part of the tradition, may it enrich our existence and cultural life. For long years we have been longing for and expecting such types of events. May "Viva Arte Viva" be echoed from the "City of Lagoons" to our "City of Art" and may these words be exclaimed also in our country.
















Birch trees, oil on canvas, 80x120cm, 2017






Creation, 200 x1 60cm, oil on canvas, 2002-2017



She also deals with clay sculpting, photography and video ...

Her motto: "Positivism and perseverance, the right work attitude are the key to success. Thus, she loves to work with people, because the flow of energies represents a specific interpersonal interaction, and the quality of knowledge leads to success in a chosen area." "When talking about the painter's art, we must emphasize that Nuša Smolič at the time of her studying developed an extremely original way of telling a story by painting colors on canvas. Her painterly gestures are primal, robust, fast and rich; such manner of painting leaves marks in the color, which suddenly change directions and shapes. These marks are made spontaneously,

impulsively but also with a deep painting mindset occupying precisely defined areas on canvas. The softness of painting spots is often complemented with line-laying colors, in different directions, and multiple layers, so that the color has a haptic effect on the admirer of her paintings. Such color formations spontaneously invite us to touch and feel. The painter intensifies the strong activity of color moves with a highly chromatic color palette, where different color values coexist and construct dialogues in contrasts, especially in complementary and light aspects. In this way, the visual field receives a dramatic tension that grows into strong color forces which are never idle. And it is this feature that basically defines the paintings by Nuša Smolič: paint on canvas, which she touches, turns into an unstoppable movement. From color stains color paths, guides, and circles are formed. The color, which was originally a dead material, acquires in her passion for painting the characteristic of explosive dynamics, paving the way for its own activities; sometimes in the sense of a calm journey, then again in the form of a violent outbreak. The visual field has become a testing ground which records the intensity of painting changes; the inner impulses of the author's psychological dynamics translate into an enthusiastic line and a color stain. In this sense, the image is a materialized area of contact between the internal and the external, the tangible and the intangible, the visible and the invisible. Such art process requires work on several canvases simultaneously, in parallel, in series, especially on large formats. Paintings by Nuša Smolič explore different motives; ranging from absolutely clearly identifiable to the abstracted traces where we encounter objects, figures and landscapes."

Dorian's artwork developement is greatly influenced by artists such as Andy Warhol, Robert Rauschenberg, Roy Liechtenstein, Jeff Koons and Damien Hirst.

He is also collector of antiquities, works of arts and books. His fields of interests include interior furnishing and designing, restoration, military items collections...

BTC first started to collect lithographs. and later also artworks employing other artistic techniques. The collection of lithographs made up an entire gallery, which currently consists of more than 400 astonishing works of art, some of which are put on display in public places in BTC City Ljubljana and BTC Murska Sobota. BTC's aim was to bring culture and art closer to the people, so that they could enjoy it not only in cultural institutions, but also in an open environment such as BTC City. The space of art is the space of creativity – artists are the ones who tear down the norms of academia and use their power to seek other, different solutions. The BTC's art collection has undoubtedly added to the rise of creativity and cultural consciousness, the accessibility of cultural goods and their creation, and to cultural diversity. The goal is to broaden Slovenian and international cultural spaces and enable people to be surrounded by different cultures that can enrich their lives.

Today, BTC is synonymous with an open, modern, and progressive company with a more than 60-year-long tradition. BTC City Ljubljana is recognised as one of the largest business, shopping, entertainment, recreational, sports, and cultural centres in South-East Europe. The company's business culture is based on modern technologies, innovation, corporate social responsibility, and sustainable development. BTC's business growth is fuelled by the constant development of its shopping centres in Ljubljana, Murska Sobota, and Novo mesto, by the Logistics Centre and its services, by property and facility management for various clients, and by new, innovative and digitally based ventures exploring smart hi-tech solutions that will enable BTC and its partners to

constantly develop their business. BTC has received international recognition with its BTC City Ljubljana, located on the outskirts of the capital city of Slovenia. BTC City Ljubljana is easily accessible and rich with a diverse range of content - as such, it attracts more than 21 million visitors per year. Visitors can enjoy more than 450 shops, an open market, a floral market, open-air food court, and a variety of services spread around the entire area of BTC City, including Atlantis Water Park and Sports Centre Millenium, or the business atmosphere in one of our business centres. Cultural vibrancy is felt wherever

you go, especially in BTC SiTi Teater, which has an annual audience of more than 34,000 people. BTC truly comes to life with big international events such as Marathon Franja BTC City, which celebrated its already 36th iteration in 2017 - the marathon is held under the auspices of UCI and records the participation of about 8,000 cyclists from all around the world.

The most precious feature of BTC City Ljubljana is without a doubt the space that is being continuously built and transformed by the BTC Company. Every year, there are new infrastructural and green projects that come to fruition. Environmental care and sustainable development are the building blocks of this "green city", while cutting-edge digital technologies form the basis of BTC as a "smart city". In the past three years, BTC has planted about 300 new trees, introduced several one-way roads, increased the number of bike lanes, and carried out more or less extensive park greenings. The company has also erected sculptures in the area, which are accessible to visitors and endow the space with added value. Due to the large scale of the urban redesign that was part of BTC's operational restructuring, more than 50 architects and urban planners have implemented their projects in BTC City Ljubljana.

INTEGRATION AND COOPERATION - A RECIPE FOR SUCCESS

The long-term business success of BTC is based on a harmonious relationship between business operations and their social and natural environments. USA. It creates new opportunities for young people to exchange their knowledge and examples of best practice, helping them achieve global success.

Insports, BTC is recognised and appreciated as a partner in the organisation of the traditional cycling event Marathon Franja BTC City, as the co-founder of Slovenia's first professional women's cycling team BTC City Ljubljana, and as a supporter of Ski Jumping Club Ljubno BTC and the FIS Ski Jumping World Cup Ladies in Ljubno. In collaboration with Gorenje, BTC has also revived the iconic Rog brand of bikes.

Younger generations are also at the heart of BTC's focus. Theatre enthusiasts can indulge in sensational performances, providing audiences with laughter and tears, exhilaration and surprise, and, of course, incentive for reflection. But art and culture are not limited to one venue alone - they pervade the entirety of BTC City Ljubljana. A stroll around the varied space of BTC City Ljubljana, which was designed by domestic as well as foreign architects and urban planners, is an experiential journey in itself.

There is an increasing amount of green areas, surrounded by many squares and parks adorned with impressive works of art, whose power of expression culturally enriches the surroundings and contributes to the added value of BTC's spatial variety. BTC boasts an extensive collection of timeless works of art by domestic and foreign artists, which it continuously updates. With its art collection, it recognises the importance of artists, contributes to the advancement of culture and brings it closer to the people. 
Art and Human Race /

"Reflections on Art by the Founder, Owner and Leader of the Institute Atelje Art Murn International, Miha Murn"

Throughout human history, there has always been a higher will to create, a will to pursue art. An individual has always wanted to date, demonstrate, explain or merely express something in every human culture. Art has always opened possibilities for all of the above and it has laid the foundations within our boundless mental space for all that is, for all that exists. It has shown us the meaning of expressiveness and emotions that we have given life to in several ways through our sense of visual aesthetics. An expressive ability has opened to us boundless opportunities to declare, feel and express everything that we carry within us. Every human being has their own unique content that shapes their individual role on the face of the earth. Every human being can express everything they want, at any time they want, by using this unique content.

Art shapes space and time in the highest sense, it is the only tool that enables an individual to enter a higher reality, the one that contains more truth than the reality we like to call "real". Science will never be able to provide proofs for that which can be made evident through art. In the field of science, everything has its visible purpose, meaning, need ... Art, on the other hand, is the realm where the visible or the real is not important. What counts, is only the satisfaction the authors experience when they please the senses and when they express their inner world, their inner content. Art has always somehow been ahead of the culture and techniques of its time, however, it has always been an influential factor in their development. We can say with a great certainty that art has, throughout human history, represented a metaphysical moment of human work and creativity. On one hand, art is connected to the technical procedures and on the other, to the ability to perceive the visible and invisible. Science uses perceptions and observations to give rise to further thinking, experimenting and formulating hypotheses. Art, however, sees these perceptions and observations as stimuli that an artist, through their thoughts and imagination, transforms into a work of art. Through all the perceptions, techniques, imagination and stimuli, artists create value, produced through art and aesthetics. Aesthetics is not only about some overall beauty, ideality and usefulness but also about pleasing human senses and perceptions. By being aware that art per se carries a more or less ideological potential, it is possible to understand and explain the interest in art that can be positive as well as negative and can be reshaped through society and culture. Throughout historical cultures, a certain enthusiasm and interest in art has always existed and never entirely disappeared. Aesthetics and art have always been basic common values of humanity; therefore they have been present throughout entire human history. Human beings have always had the need for the beautiful, the designed and the aesthetic ... Art has developed from some sort of "common art", from the so-called representation of the visible into the mentally designed world of the invisible. Nowadays, abstract art is the truest symbol and the proof of the existence of the world of invisibility and omnipo-

tence. As artists can freely choose their motives, compositions, materials, etc. without any kind of limitation or repression, abstract art opens unlimited horizons for creating and satisfying all the senses of human beings. Abstract art is one of the most demanding artistic styles because its intention is not merely to decorate and be a medium of a certain message but to depict the idea of boundlessness. This artistic style is also one of the few, where no concrete rules apply, one of the few, where creators are free to leave their works untitled and freed from the limitation of motives and frameworks to be able to use their full power of expression. This stlye leaves every choice to the author and does not limit them with the rules or patterns of what is acceptable in a certain society or environment. Abstraction enables an artist to break the cycle of values and rules and it can, through a single bold move, turn the traditional world upside down. It is one of the artistic styles which is the most difficult to comprehend and one of the most disputable forms of expression. Abstract art is often viewed as some "thing" and not as a creation, as many are convinced that as a matter of fact, anyone can work and create within the field of abstract art. The majority sees it as some sort of nonsense and some incomprehensible depiction of the world. This shows a lack of awareness that art is not a depiction of the world but of something higher, a product of our ideas with no link to the real world. Almost everyone who does not take interest in art or is not in contact with the artists somehow despises it and this is why art becomes so special. People have become narrow-minded and caught in the socially acceptable patterns, they have forgotten about the possibility of the broad perspective and thinking, about the new, about that which has not come to exist yet. Most of the people in the art have become "slaves" to the traditional styles, where an unwillingness to look further into a new sphere of creativity and a lack of awareness of that which is yet to come prevail. However, they will inevitably have to discover once that almost everything has been done in art before and that almost every artistic style has emerged throughout the history of the human kind. However, one of the greatest styles has not been done before and this is abstract art. More and more individuals present themselves as modern conceptual artists. Hopefully, they will manage to make the blind see again and show to the society that the art of today is about good ideas and performance and not about some sort of search for purpose and sense of creativity. This is not what the role of the artworks is. People have slowly forgotten, or maybe some have never known that art has to exist, regardless of its usefulness. We need it because a great majority of what we feel and think can be expressed through words, music or action and because certain thoughts that are buried deep within us can only be expressed by creating new artworks. Through creating, we not only help ourselves find the best expression, but we also try to share the artworks with others and this is why they need to be exhibited. Through practising art, the author of the artworks, as well as the audience who have seen and experienced it improve themselves. This effect of pleasure, derived from a contact with an artwork, has been known since the period of Archaic art in the ancient Greece. This time was marked by the emergence of the first works of art that were not created for a strictly defined purpose but for the sake of the personal decision, because of the inherent idea and the aesthetic pleasure that it can provide. This period saw an overall awakening of the artistic field as several discussions and texts on art started emerging. It was the beginning of the assessment of artworks and this practice resulted in faster improvements of the established styles of the period. It was a revolutionary turning point in art as no discussions or assessments in art from the earlier periods had been



known. Be it the first cave paintings in Lascaux and in Altamira, or various anthropomorphic figurines and products made of iron from the Iron Age, or the Mesopotamian ziggurats and the Ishtar Gate, or the great Egyptian pyramids and temples, the art of the Minoan civilisation and paintings in the vast palaces, or the Mycenaean military art - the ancient Greek art had brought something new, previously unfamiliar in all of the above arts. It was the first to define some truly sound rules on symmetry, perspective, ratio and scale. Greek art was followed by Etruscan and Roman art, which brought some innovations, especially in the field of construction, such as arch and dome. Romans introduced and gave meaning to the portrait in the field of sculpture. Their art had a touch of realism and sharp psychological depth to it. Soon after, Christianity, a strictly persecuted religion of that time, started to spread in the territory of the Roman Empire. The Edict of Milan by the emperor Constantin I in 313 AD gave Christianity a legal status and this brought a revival in Christian art, the foundation for many a later historical period in art in our space. Later on, a connection emerged between Christian motives and symbols and Byzantine art with its centre in the modern-day Istanbul. This resulted in development of mosaics, frescoes and icons in that area. Meanwhile, various peoples, among them Lombards, Franks, Angles, etc., started populating the Roman Empire and developed a method of massive construction of stone buildings as well as a method of miniature painting. One of the most beautiful examples of miniature painting, the Book of Kells, dates back to this period. Later on, the period of Carolingian art emerged in Europe. Charles the Great renewed the institution of church and took initiative to restore the Roman Empire with the assistance of the pope and helped art gain new momentum. This artistic period is also characterized by its use of subject matter from antiquity in the visual artworks. On the contrary, the following period of Ottonian art searched for inspiration mostly in Byzantine art, even though the influence of art was still present. The Ottonian period in architecture, sculpture and painting was further influenced by the tradition, established by the first emperor, who was crowned by the pope himself in 800 AD and was therefore considered the holy Emperor of Europe. In those times, the artworks were mostly commissioned by the court of the emperor, by the church and rich individuals to demonstrate their noble status in society. This was also the case in ancient Egypt. The time of Ottonian art was followed by Romanesque art that was influential by the early thirteenth century. It was a period, when monastic cultures, pilgrimage sites, pilgrimages flourished and when monastic orders developed. The institution of church as well as all of these events importantly influenced art. Consequently, sacred buildings were among the most common architectural projects of that time. These also remained prevalent during the following period of Gothic art, which was greatly influenced by the emerging nation-kingdoms, crusades, phenomena of the mendicant orders, rapid economic development and the spreading of the urban residential areas. At the time, the strength of the bourgeoisie increased and they were commissioning more and more artworks and became important supporters of art. In the field of architecture of the time, there was an emergence of the skeletal construction, with walls reaching dizzying heights and with multicoloured windows that made the building convey the image of holiness. Thus, a simple uneducated human would feel there as if they had come to paradise. The gothic period was characterized by total works of art (Gesammtkunstwerke) that could only be created by use of all the art disciplines, from sculpture to painting and architecture. The rebirth in art, the so-called Renaissance, started in the fourteenth century. It was also a time when humanism and

the bourgeoisie began to increasingly support art and to protect it. The intellectuals, the well-educated and gifted individuals close to the modern idea of an "artistic genius", increasingly gained importance. In the Renaissance Italy, Leonardo da Vinci, the genius of architecture, engineering, a great inventor, sculptor and a poet created works of art that have remained a key basis for exploring the rules in creative process. The revival of naturalism and the culture of antiquity in the Renaissance period gained completely different dimensions than in the Gothic period. Centrally-planned buildings and redesigned elements of classical architectural components emerged in the architecture of the time. Further improvements in architecture were achieved in the following period of Baroque by the inclusion of elements of sculpture and painting. There was an enormous rise of absolutist monarchies that greatly influenced art around Europe in the seventeenth and eighteenth century. The principles of Catholic renewal were expressed in the painting of that time through the application of religious motives, but not so much in the protestant countries of the Northern Europe. Some of the most famous architects, among them Giovanni Lorenzo Bernini, Francesco Borromini and painters, such as Peter Paul Rubens and Rembrandt Harmenszoon van Rijn, created in that period. The modern era also brought the emergence of Rococo, a new artistic style from France. The development of this style can be traced through artworks, commissioned by the aristocracy and artworks, inspired by the exotic cultures. Sculpture of the time was especially decorative in nature and this influence caused sculptors to mostly create miniature sculptures. There was a similar situation in painting of the Rococo period. After 1770, Neoclassicism emerged in art and it reached the peak of its influence during the France's bourgeois revolution. Neoclassicism can be understood as a response to Baroque or Rococo, while its development was also influenced by some of the socio-political and cultural conditions of the time. Sculpture of that period drew on classical Antiquity for its form and subject matter. Meanwhile, painters emphasized the message connected to the ancient antique ethics. Clean, clear and simple forms prevailed in architecture. All of this changed with the nineteenth century that saw emerging of Historicism in architecture. There was an increasing interest in the past in this period. Besides renovation works on various significant monuments, the construction of one of the most famous buildings worldwide took place. It was a time when Charles Barry constructed the Palace of Westminister in London, when the architect Charles Garnier built the famous opera house in Paris and when the Provincial Theatre in Ljubljana (Deželno gledališče v Ljubljani) was constructed by the architect Jan Vladimir Hrasky. The technological progress and the influence of the industrial revolution became a subject matter in the art in the second half of the nineteenth century. It was the industrial revolution that introduced the so-called "engineering architecture" that gave rise to several bold constructions by civil engineers. The materials used in the construction of buildings were mostly steel, glass and iron. The best example of that architectural style is without a doubt the Eiffel Tower, built by Gustave Eiffel. Simultaneously with various other artistic movements in Europe, Romanticism emerged and it was especially influential in music, literature and, of course, in painting. Through its inherent romantic spirit, emphasis on individualism and subjectivism, the artworks influenced by Romanticism were characterized by their dramatic, elevated style and emotionality. The famous historical events and emotionally laden motives from the legends prevailed in the painting art. One of the best examples of such type of painting is the artwork Liberty Leading the People by Eugène Delacroix. Landscapes became increasingly important as they were lad-



en with symbolic meanings. Similarly, patriotic and historical contents were also present in the sculpture of the time. Meanwhile, the Realism started to emerge, at first in France. In contrast to the romanticist artists, the realists started to turn to everyday scenes from the lives of farmers, workers and other common people. It was a time of the development of lithography that increased interest in caricatures and emphasized their meaning. It was also a period of the first internationally acclaimed Slovenian painter and teacher of painting, Anton Ažbe, who reached his fame after he had founded his own private school of painting in Munich. As an expression of resistance to the naturalist and classicistic style in painting, Impressionism, which is considered a milestone between the traditional and the modern art, started to develop around 1860. Impressionists started to violate the rules of academic painting and distanced themselves from the usual historical, social and religious contents. Artists developed a habit of painting outdoors and no longer found their inspiration in the studio which was called plenerism. Some of the most well known European painters of the period were certainly Édouard Manet, Claude Monet, Pierre Auguste Renoir and Edgar Degas. There were also four important Impressionists in Slovenia: Matija Jama, Ivan Grohar, Matei Sternen and Rihard Jakopič. Later on, Post-impressionism developed as a result of freedom of artistic thought. The time of Post-modernist painting was certainly marked by the greatest Dutch painter after Rembrandt, Vincent van Gogh, who was one of the first to understand art as an expression of personality. Painting thus became extremely diverse. At the end of the nineteenth century, art started looking for a richer and a more intellectually challenging subject matter. In a similar fashion, distancing from the emptied subject matter of the academic art also took place in sculpture. It became clear soon afterwards that everything was possible in art because artists realized that rules no longer had to be observed and that they no longer had to pay such a strict attention to the influence of the socio-political developments. There was also a development of Symbolism, an artistic movement that inspired each artist to develop their unique personal style. Works of art started to be understood as an idea. Painting created close bonds to literature and music. This was also a time when the "femme fatale" subject matter was introduced, representing an erotic relationship between a man and a fatally attractive female. One of the most important painters of that period was Edvard Munch, whose painting the Scream expresses everything that symbolism strived for. After Symbolism, art focused mostly on the usability and decorativity of artworks, while its subject matter still remained closely linked to Symbolism. This international movement is called Art Nouveau. In this time, the use of various combinations of materials and new patterns was emphasized. Painting of the time was characterized by an excessive decorativity. Artists sought their inspiration in the ancient styles and found ways to innovatively redesign them. This was also a period when posters became widespread artistic products. One of the greatest contributions in achieving this can be ascribed to Henry de Toulouse, who surprised the public with posters that communicated various events in 1890. The most famous architect of the period was most certainly Antonio Gaudi with his sensational Basilica and Expiatory Church of the Holy Family in Barcelona. The most recognizable painter was definitely Gustav Klimt. He was an Austrian illustrator, painter and the leading representative of the Vienna Secession. The coming twentieth century brought changes in all the areas of social life and consequently also changes in the field of visual art. Art started to emphasize changes in developments and ideas on the changing lifestyles. The pace of life became a lot faster. Einstein's theory of relativity

shaped a new understanding of time and space and Freud's definition and explanation of subconsciousness started to change the view on human nature. These radical changes required art to "modernise" and redefine its position and meaning in the society. Consequently, the early modernist avant-gardes emerged. Each of them communicated their artistic standpoints through their visions and manifests. In the midst of these developments, Fauvism, a style of artists with a shared preference for pure colours, emerged. The meaning and power of the colour is also emphasized in Expressionism that was a response to the conditions in the society. This movement is mostly characterized by deformation of bodies and shapes, painted in intense colours. Futurism is another avant-garde movement which emphasized the break with the human history and called for the faith in technology and speed of development. Cubism was the most radical avant-garde movement, as it rejected all the rules of mimesis as well as painting of objects with the help of perspective and it established new principles. This movement introduced a new technique in the visual arts, called collage. The most recognizable artist of this movement and also the most famous artist of the twentieth century was the Spaniard Pablo Picasso. Constructivist movement had a different understanding of art from Cubism. These artists advocated interconnectedness of life and art and aimed at putting their artworks to practical use; therefore they started applying the technique of montage in their creative processes. By contrast to the idea of artworks with a utilitarian purpose, Surrealists, influenced by André Breton, included subconsciousness and dreams in their creative activities. This avant-garde movement systematically attacked the bourgeoisie and acknowledged the Freudian dream analysis. Some of the most famous members of this movement were Salvador Felip Jacint Dalí Domènech and René François Ghislain Magritte. Simultaneously with the avant-garde movements, there was also an emergence of the abstract art that was no longer considered one of the historical artistic movements, but a manner of expression. This is an artistic style that no longer uses the material world in its depictions. One of the most famous movements of the abstract art was lyrical abstraction, introduced by the Russian artist Vasilij Vasiljevič Kandinsky. This period was also greatly marked by the work of the famous Dutch painter, Piet Mondrian. After the Second World War, New York became the new centre of visual arts and it was the place where abstract expressionism and pop art developed. Pop art started to depict the world of consumerism and introduced a new graphic technique called screen-printing. Later on, with the emergence of conceptual art, art moved from closed to open spaces. Shorty after, in the 1980s, the new figural painting became more and more influential than abstraction and it gave rise to postmodernism. Quite soon, contemporary art emerged, an artistic style where all rules of creating are dissolved and where new techniques of depicting became widespread. This movement has been firmly rooted in the world of art until today and it enables artists to express their individuality.

Thus, we can see that art has become more individualized nowadays than ever throughout history. In the past, it had to serve the regimes and individual rulers and it had to limit its moves and conform itself to the acceptable forms of expression in a certain regime. Nowadays, the seeming freedom of speech and democracy has opened opportunities for unlimited expression and art has gained a new momentum for innovation. Thus, the contemporary art of today is one of the best ways to express our individuality and our thinking without any kind of social constraints.



Digitalisation in art /

Before a man wanted to publish a book, he needed a publisher. When one wanted to be a journalist, he needed to work in some medium. When one wanted to shoot a movie, he had to work for the studio. Nowadays things are different. Today, options are available for everyone as never before. "The ongoing technological revolution has an impact comparable to the introduction of electricity on a global civilization," says Julius Genachowski, former head of the US Federal Communications Commission, and I can only agree.

Modern technology is changing our everyday life. Who has a paper map today in the car? Everything seems real-time. News, communications, information ... Modern technology brings users a unique opportunity to simplify life, save time, but also expand learning. One way, thanks to its availability, can be mobile applications. Surveys show that the smartphone owns more than ¾young people around the world. In Asia, it is even more than 83%. This gives developers the ability to reach a huge number of users. There is also the risk that useless or poorly programmed applications may become completely unaware in the flood of new and better applications. This puts high demands on what the user expects from the application.

For example, if I had to think over a small application in the gallery that would at least bring about innovation, I would have to start with what users want. I do not know typical artists or gallery visitors. I suppose artists have their own creation in the first place, which they would like to find a customer. But they often neglect their digital presentation, according to what I found, I suppose that visitors could welcome a new look at the creation of an artist. This could be the story of an image if the author tells him. Or look at the picture in the context of his work. How he changed his art-style and so on. Or if a visitor is interested in an artist, I can imagine he wants to see all his works.

For example, QR code could be in the image label. A small element that would not divert attention from the art. An interested customer would be able to access this content after scanning this code on a mobile device. The story of the art he's looking at. Story about the author. View the context in which the work created. The visitor could find out what other works the artist has created with information where they can be viewed or purchased.

The artist gains a new space to present himself and his works. Even if only two works were exhibited in the gallery, thanks to this space the visitor would get to his complete creation right now. I could imagine that the application creator could also implement a payment or booking system for works. In this way, the customer could reserve a art for a short time in an artist's studio. And then just come and see it.

It was also possible to implement advanced search in artists' works. If each image in the database contains technical information such as a technique of creation, art, date of origin, country of origin ... It would be easier for a visitor to search for works that he wants to prefer.

Another thing could be to use data from a marketing application. If a customer's history shows what kind of art he is interested in (from his search or sales), he could target relevant advertising for other exhibitions or new works by authors. I do not know if there is space for such a technical approach in the art. It would also require the creation of a large database of data, a collaboration of artists who often do not have to be inclined to the digital world. But it is an example of an application that could easily expand the space for art in the gallery.



My name is Jan Rasiewicz. I'm an artist, a creator. And I'm no less of one for having started painting only six years ago. I'm a bachelor of economicsand perhaps stand out a bit at family reunions, where I'm surroundedonly by academic musicians. For the past 16 years, I found myself in the world of IT sales, where things can become monotonous after a while. It's hard to stay motivated and achieve sales targets when facing stiff competition and a difficult market situation. However, by painting, creating something unique with a message, I found a door into a whole new world, where I can express myselfunrestrained. My artistic output is the result of a straightforward need to create. The paintings, which are part of my latestseries called "AQUA", draw on my love of family, nature, art, and life in general. These are also the bases for the short stories associated with most of my paintings. Each story had a profound effect on me in one way or another. My maincreative medium for the series is a special epoxy resin, which I thenmix with different pigments and acrylic paints. The end result are "wet" looking abstract paintings, which standout, since not many authors use similar techniques. For the pastcouple of years, I have been selling my paintings through my own website and ETSY. My paintings can be found in private and commercial collections everywhere from the US, South America, and Canada to Europe and Hong Kong. My success is founded on hard work. I'm often called bizarre. And I know in my heart that it's true. I also firmly believe that one day, I'll be able to support myself exclusively through my art. This is my ultimate goal and I aim to achieve it. Afterall these years of following my creative path, I can't shake off the feeling that the Slovene artworld is isolated, especially when it comes to fine art. Young artists find it very hard to carve out a niche in Slovenia. While we have galleries, they have relatively high operating costs, which results in high commissions. That's one of the reasons I decided to focus on selling more to customers from other countries via the internet.

I still sell more paintings abroad than at home. At the start of 2017, I attended a project presentation organized by the InstituteAtelje Art Murn International and very quickly realized that the Slovenian artworld has been given a breath of fresh air. An enthusiastic team, full of fresh ideas and unorthodox approaches, is trying to bring art and culture closer to people in an original and fun way. They place special emphasis on linking culture and art with companies. The main benefit offered to artists is unoccupied office space. With the help of the AAMI Institute, artists are given the opportunity to use these spaces for various purposes (for displaying our work, organizing workshops and lectures or exhibitions, etc.). Through the AAMI platform, artists have also been given the opportunity to exhibit their work in various successful Slovene companies. During meetings and events organized by them, we are also given the chance to network, meet new people, and find new opportunities. Through its platform, the AAMI Institute is also expanding to foreign markets, openingnew doors for artists. They are currently already active in the Czech Republic and setting up in Hong Kong, where the burgeoning economy is creating new opportunities and sales channels for interested local authors. It is well known that the Far East is interested in anything European. And local buyers are prepared to pay well. I think that collaborating with the AAMI Institute has a host of advantages. I would advise all local artists to check them out and start using their services. The largest project of them all -the Art Expo Ljubljana-is also a goldenopportunity for artists, cultural workers, and creators, because it allows us to present the results of our creative work to the public. It helps us get closer to other artists and our target audiences. It's going to be awesome to see so much creative talent in one place. I'm currently actively preparing for the event and look forward to being there.




